

Drop A Few My Way v2.1

AppleScript for iTunes

Find more **free** AppleScripts

at Doug's AppleScripts for iTunes.

Drag and drop audio files to this droplet to have iTunes convert them with an encoder selected on the fly, restoring iTunes' Preferences-set encoder afterwards. Converted files are saved to a selected location. The converted files/tracks are removed from iTunes; it is as though iTunes "never saw them".

Installation:

To manually install: Put AppleScripts in your iTunes Scripts folder. This is located in *[user name] > Library > iTunes*. If there is no folder named "Scripts" there, create one and put the script(s) in it. AppleScripts will then appear in iTunes' Script menu, and can be activated by selecting by name and clicking. Be sure to also save this Read Me document in a safe and convenient place.

However...

This is a "droplet", an AppleScript application that is activated when files are dragged to it. You can place this script anywhere you find it convenient to access. It can be added to the Dock or – my favorite place – a Finder window's toolbar.

How to use:

Drag one or more audio files to the **Drop A Few My Way** icon. Select the iTunes encoder to use to convert them, and choose a location to save the converted files.

Audio files that are unable to be converted using the selected encoder will be ignored.

Original files will not be deleted or affected in any way.

Issues

- The script cannot change encoder Settings (bit rate, sample rate, and so on). The selected encoder's Settings will be the same as they were the last time you set them in iTunes > Preferences > Import Settings....
- Because each file must be encoded one at a time, the iTunes "done chime" will sound after each file is converted. Alas.

- Files which cannot be converted (text or graphic files, for example) or are otherwise error-causing will prompt a message in the "Done" dialog to display "(One or more files may not have been converted correctly.)"
- Track information from the original file (if any) is **not** transferred to the converted file.
- Because of quality issues, converting compressed audio files to another compression format (converting an MP3 to AAC, for example) is not recommended. YMWV.
